Section 4: FIRST AID MEASURES

First Aid Measures:	Consult the National Poisons Centre on 0800 POISON (0800 764 766) or a doctor immediately in every case of suspected poisoning.

Advice to Doctor:	No specific antidote. Treat symptomatically. If vomiting is induced, suggest endotracheal and/or oesophageal control. Danger from lung aspiration must be weighed against toxicity when considering emptying the stomach.

Section 11: TOXICOLOGICAL INFORMATION

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Inhalation:	Not normally a hazard due to non-volatile nature of product. The material is not thought to produce either adverse health effects or irritation of the respiratory tract following inhalation.
Ingestion:	<p>Levamisole Hydrochloride: Oral LD50 ; 480 mg/kg (rat), 210 mg/kg (mouse)</p> <p>Albendazole: Oral LD50 2,400 mg/kg (rat)</p> <p>Praziquantel: Oral LD50 2,840 mg/kg (rat), 2454 mg/kg (mouse), >200 mg/kg (dog), 1,050 mg/kg (rabbit)</p> <p>Accidental ingestion of the material may be harmful. Hypersensitivity reactions such as fever, an influenza-like syndrome, joint pain, muscle pain, skin rashes and inflammation of the cutaneous blood vessels, may occur. Central nervous system effects such as fatigue, headache, confusion, sleeplessness, dizziness, excitation and convulsions have been reported. Other side-effects include blood abnormalities such as loss of white blood cells and platelets, and digestive disturbances, such as abnormal taste in the mouth. Benzimidazole carbamate anthelmintics, used at doses for treatment, have produced allergic reaction (which may be associated with destruction of parasites), raised liver enzyme values, and may be associated with loss of white cells and hair. Extremely large oral doses may produce intestinal cramps, loss of appetite, lethargy, lung bleeding, oedema, liver and epicardial bleeding, and nausea, vomiting and diarrhoea. Other symptoms include dizziness, giddiness, ringing in the ears, sleeplessness, anxiety, confusion, convulsions, hallucinations and headache. Overdose may produce gastrointestinal symptoms, visual disturbance and psychic changes. These drugs are not well absorbed.</p>
Skin:	Entry into the blood-stream, through for example, cuts, abrasions or lesions, may produce systemic injury with harmful effects. May cause skin irritation on prolonged contact. Is a contact sensitiser.
Eye:	May cause transient discomfort
Chronic Effects:	There is limited evidence that skin contact with this product is more likely to cause a sensitisation reaction in some persons compared to the general population. Sensitisation may result in allergic dermatitis responses including rash, itching, hives or swelling of extremities.
Reproductive Toxicity:	There is some evidence from animal testing that exposure to this material may result in toxic effects to the unborn baby
